‘Constitution Day’ Celebration 26th November, 2019

The existence and successful survival of ‘**Democracy**’ in diverse conditions is the most celebrated fact about our country and Constitution is its backbone. To reinforce the significance and importance of Constitution, the Government of India declared 26th of November as Constitution Day, in remembrance of the Father of Indian Constitution, **Dr. B. R. ‘Constitution Day’ was celebrated with great enthusiasm at IIIT Nagpur on 26th November 2019.

This day is also known as “संविधान दिवस” On this day in 1949, the Constituent Assembly of India adopted the Constitution of India, and it went into effect on 26th January 1950. World's lengthiest written Constitution had 395 articles in 22 parts and 8 schedules at the time of commencement. Now Constitution of India have 448 articles in 25 parts, 12 schedules, 5 appendices and 103 amendments.

To create awareness about the Constitution Day I general and about the Fundamental Duties of the Citizens mentioned in the Constitution in particular, relevant information was displayed on all the Notice Boards of the Institute.

‘Constitution Day’ was celebrated in IIITN by reading the preamble of the Constitution and reading of the Fundamental Duties as enshrined in Article 51A of the Constitution and then singing National Anthem in the presence of Dr. O. G. Kakde Director IIIT, Nagpur.
